
INTERVENTION: <u>Performance Indicators</u> are assigned to Gen Med and each subspecialty, and regularly monitored by Med-QIC Committee

- Training: Regular Monthly Quality Morning Lectures, and participation in CCITP training & projects, SBAR Training & mini-workshops
- Involvement : Clinicians at all levels are assigned to various quality & patient safety functions (Audits, Morbidity & Mortality committee, Guidelines committee, medical records review, IHI Best Care Always Campaign)
