Outcome of Group Therapy within the HMC Early Intervention Program

AIM: To demonstrate the effectiveness of Group Therapy in children recruited to the HMC Early Intervention Program over a period of 3 months.

INTERVENTION ::

- Early Intervention Program was initiated with the concept of Family Centered Model Of Care.
- Group Therapy schemes were developed to support children in developing skills across all developmental domains by using Inter-Disciplinary model of services.
- Space and equipment were organized to promote group therapy activities in a child friendly environment.
- Group Therapy sessions were conducted using pre-planned activities incorporating use of modern technology as appropriate.
- Families were educated and later supervised to take active roles as the child progressed within the group.
- Over 150 infants and toddlers are receiving intervention in our program in group therapy schemes.
- 30 children were selected to demonstrate the success of group therapy schemes.
- Family feedback and opinion has been taken in consideration to develop this scheme further.





CONCLUSIONS:

- Our results demonstrated that children and their families who have been involved in group therapy benefitted a great deal and the children showed substantial improvement across all developmental domains.
- The concept of Group Therapy should be promoted to all children with special needs who may attend other settings, including children attending Preschool Integration programs.
- Group therapy services could be seen as a way forward towards efficient use of time and resources.

NEXT STEPS:
